DRAFT MINUTES NOT APPROVED BY THE BOARD

Mayor Pro-tem Bell called the regular meeting to order at 7:00 p.m. on August 17, 2021 via zoom.

Mayor Pro-tem Bell stated under the invocation we would have a moment of silence for the two staff members that lost family this week.

Mayor Pro-tem Bell led in the pledge of allegiance.

Mayor Pro-tem Bell called the roll:

Staff Present: Darla Sapp, City Clerk, Nathan Nickolaus, City Attorney, Lelande Rehard, Assistant City Administrator, James Creel, Public Works Director and Dan Vandevoorde, Building Inspector.

Mayor Pro-tem Bell presented the minutes of the August 03, 2021 Board meeting for consideration. Alderman Lewis made motion to approve the minutes as presented Alderwoman Old seconded the motion. Mayor Pro-tem Bell called for the vote. Motion carried.

Mayor Pro-tem Bell presented the minutes of the Special Meeting on August 09, 2021 for consideration. Alderwoman Old made motion and seconded by Alderman Lewis to approve the minutes as presented. Mayor Pro-tem Bell called for the vote. Motion carried.

Mayor Pro-tem Bell presented the agenda for adjustments. Alderwoman Old made motion and seconded by Alderman Lewis to approve the agenda. Mayor Pro-tem Bell called for the vote. Motion carried.

Mayor Pro-tem Bell presented Ordinance No. 1375, an ordinance establishing the property tax rate for the City of Ashland for the year 2021 and amending Chapter 5; Tax Rates; Appendix A-1 of the Ashland Municipal Code. Alderwoman Old made motion and seconded by Alderman Lewis to take up Ordinance No. 1375, an ordinance establishing the property tax rate for the City of Ashland for the year 2021 and amending Chapter 5; Tax Rates; Appendix A-1 of the Ashland Municipal Code. Mayor Pro-tem Bell called for the staff report. Lelande Rehard, Assistant City Administrator stated this is the second reading and this is the annual adoption of the property tax rate of 0.204 for the City of Ashland. Mayor Pro-tem Bell called for comments from the public. Mayor Pro-tem Bell called for questions or comments from the Board. Mayor Pro-tem Bell called for the vote. Alderman Lewis-aye, Alderwoman Old-aye, Alderwoman Selby-aye, Alderman Slinker-aye, Alderman Volkart-aye. Motion carried.

Mayor Pro-tem Bell presented a Resolution of intent to award the contract to Christensen Construction for the 2021 Mill and Overlay Street Project. Mayor Pro-tem Bell called for the staff report. Lelande Rehard stated the Board approved for the staff to put this project out for bid. He stated we received one bid from Christensen Construction. James Creel, Public Works Director reported he bid out for the street mill and overlay project and received a sole bid and that was from Christensen Construction. He stated the other contractors did not bid because they could not fit the work in their booked schedules. He reported the bid came in at \$185,827.50. He stated this is approximately 41% of the street repairs, supplies, and maintenance annual budget. He stated their projected cost was \$300,000.00. He stated this bid was set up in a unit manner, which allowed for additional streets to be milled and overlaid as the funds allowed. James

Creel stated we could add some streets at the same pricing. He stated he checked with the company and they are open to this. Mayor Pro-tem called for a motion. Alderwoman Old made motion and seconded by Alderman Lewis to approve the resolution of intent to award the contract to Christensen Construction for the 2021 Mill and Overlay Street Project. Mayor Pro-tem Bell called for the vote. Alderman Lewis-aye, Alderwoman Old-aye, Alderwoman Selby-aye, Alderman Slinker-aye, Alderman Volkart-aye. Motion carried.

Mayor Pro-tem Bell presented a request from the Ashland Parks and Recreation to allow alcohol in the City Park at the September 11, 2021 Fall Festival.

Lelande Rehard, Assistant City Administrator stated that Tracy Banning, Chairman for the Parks and Recreation Board and Marcy Wood were also present on this meeting and could explain this better. Marcy Wood stated they submitted the request for alcohol sales and location layout as well as a little question and answer information sheet. She stated the Fall Festival is scheduled for September 11. She stated the alcohol sales will start at 5:00 p.m. and end at 9:00 p.m. with a band playing. She stated Woody's Pub N Grub is doing the Beer Tent and as applied for their City catering license and are trained for sales and distribution of alcohol sales.

Alderman Lewis stated they have done this many times in the past with no issues.

Alderwoman Old made motion and seconded by Alderwoman Selby to approve the request from the Ashland Parks and Recreation to allow alcohol in the City Park at the September 11, 2021 Fall Festival. Mayor Pro-tem Bell called for the vote. Alderman Lewis-aye, Alderwoman Old-aye, Alderwoman Selby-aye, Alderman Slinker-aye, Alderman Volkart-aye. Motion carried.

Mayor's Report:

Mayor Pro-tem Bell stated she would get with James later. She stated she knows the public works projects are behind schedule but there are smaller projects that need to be completed as well.

City Administrator's Report:

Lelande Rehard reminded the Board of the meeting with Nextsite, the Consultant for Developing Retail and Commercial sector. He stated Mr. Branch will be in attendance and we will host it at 101 West Broadway for the Board and the public will be joining via zoom. He gave an overview of the Missouri Main Street training for next week. He discussed the roundabout project and the comments that it is too low. He stated once it is finished it will make sense. He stated there has been some overruns on this project. Lelande Rehard stated they have received a cost share with MoDot and the EDA grant for the street extension. He discussed the I & I Study Bartlett & West is doing and the study of the northwest sewer. He gave an update on the two software companies for the city staff. Lelande Rehard reported the new Municipal Center remodeling project has begun.

Alderman Slinker stated he has been getting several calls on the roundabout also. He questioned the drop off issue.

Alderwoman Bell asked for an update on census from Lelande Rehard. He stated the census data is out there but not easily accessible.

City Attorney's Report:

Nathan Nickolaus, City Attorney stated he had nothing to report but he informed the Board of the passing of Fred Boeckmann former City Attorney.

Public Works Director Monthly Report:

James Creel, Public Works Director one topic is the roundabout and stated there has been multiple delays with weather, utility relocation and is about 27% complete. He stated there was unsuitable soils under the roadway which led to increased costs. He stated there has been questions of why is it so low. He stated the peak would be taken down on Broadway and the storm water issues will be addressed in the area as well. He asked that they be patient and wait and it will all make since in the end.

James Creel stated the engineering report for Russian Setter Circle has been completed but they are working with Martin Builders timeline to get this underway. He estimated late August or September weather depending. He stated City staff is working on the tennis courts and resurfacing is to start next week and taking approximately one week to complete.

James Creel stated the storm water project on Billy Joe Sapp is moving forward and the materials are currently being bid out.

He stated they are working on a plan for the Caspian Circle detention basin improvements. He stated between Kimberly Drive and Sue Drive they will be replacing the swale to improve the storm water issue.

He stated the Veterans memorial renderings should have been included in their packet. He stated the ground breaking will occur during the Fall Festival and dedication should be on Veteran's Day. He stated they are having a paver campaign and should be organized in the near future. He stated Porter, Berendzen Associates donated the renderings for this project. He stated he is excited about this and it will be a great addition to the entrance to the park.

Board of Aldermen's Reports:

Alderman Slinker reported a nuisance complaint at 115 Church Street. He questioned why some of the comments was removed from the post regarding the rezoning on Hayes Road on the Surveying Ashland Residents facebook page. Alderman Slinker asked for an update on the lawsuit.

Alderman Volkart stated he has been questioned about the property located next to Walk in Faith Church that has had a blue tarp on its roof for several years. He stated he thought we were focusing on cleaning up downtown area. He asked if we have any requirements or time frame these issues get fixed.

Mayor Pro-tem Bell called for additional comments from the public, board or staff.

John Conway, Civil Engineer stated the request for qualifications have went out and should be received by next Wednesday for a large water main replacement project.

Alderwoman Bell stated they are still selling tickets for the Boots and Bows Event through the Southern Boone County PTA and the Ashland Community Club.

Alderwoman Old reported a preliminary drawing for the mural for the Parks Restroom has been approved and the after the final approval by the Parks and Recreation Board it will be drawn out and community will be painting this during the fall festival.

Mayor Pro-tem Bell called for the adjournment.

Alderman Slinker made motion and seconded by Alderman Lewis to adjourn. Mayor Pro-tem Bell called for the vote. Motion carried.

Mayor Sullivan called the special meeting to order at 6:07 p.m. on August 24, 2021.

Mayor Sullivan called the roll:

Staff Present: Tony St. Romaine, City Administrator, Lelande Rehard, Assistant City Administrator and Darla Sapp, City Clerk.

Tony St. Romaine introduced Chuck Branch, Consultant for Nextsite.

Chuck Branch thanked Lonna Trammel and Ameren partnership with them. He stated he is exited to work with the City. He gave an overview of his company being a commercial advisory firm that specializes in getting market research and analysis to retailers and restaurants. He stated that we need to start the process with research, support ongoing effort of local business owners and entrepreneurs to provide to them information on Ashland. He stated they will be out there marketing the City of Ashland at conferences and hope to connect developers. He presented data they have gathered from Moser's Grocery Store for a 12 month period. He presented data on the amount of shoppers, times of day of customers, zip codes of shoppers. He gave an update on amount of traffic in the downtown area on a daily basis. He stated this information is useful for people starting a business and current business owners. He also presented a data on the regional trade area retail gap. He stated there is no supply for men's, women's clothing, sporting goods and jewelry. Mr. Branch stated the market analysis contacts support outreach to current and future development opportunities. He stated this is supporting existing local business owners, entrepreneurial and organic growth. He stated this is assisting existing property owners and private investment by connecting developers, tenant, reps, retailers, property owners and broker outreach. He stated they provide conference representation with the next one scheduled in Las Vegas on December 5, 2021. He stated they are expecting normal conferences in 2022.

He called for questions or comments.

Mayor Sullivan asked if this information is sent out to local business that request it. Mr. Branch stated that he wants to make sure this goes through the City so they can be part of the process. Mayor Sullivan asked about gathering data for other restaurants currently in the community to help them succeed.

Lonna Trammel commented on the shoppers at Moser's being from California, Mo being 6.2 percent.

Alderwoman Bell stated a huge struggle is day care in this community. She stated dance programs and other businesses that increase the quality of living in Ashland. She also felt there is a need for drive through food services so you don't have to get the children out of the vehicle.

Tony St. Romaine stated we need to get this information out to local developers and entrepreneurs on these gaps and hopefully spawn some interest.

Alderwoman Bell suggested the downtown people have a half day conference and tour spaces that are vacant.

Tracy Titmus stated she is the 2021 Chamber President and she asked if they could have access to this information to be able to share.

Bill Lloyd stated he likes the work Mr. Branch is doing and he will continue to support the efforts. He asked that they reach out to Silver Tree Realty, Corey Myers and other individual contractors/developers and share this information with them. Tony St. Romaine, City Administrator stated they have already shared this information with Mr. Branch.

Lonna Trammel asked if they could get updates from him.

Bill Lloyd stated we missed the 5,000 thousand population and asked if this would effect much of what you are doing. Mr. Branch stated it would not since the business would be looking at the regional area.

Mayor Sullivan suggested reaching out to Larry Potterfield and Nick Parks. He stated he wants to support the local. He stated we are growing at a fast rate and he does not want to see vacant lots for 10 years.

Mr. Branch stated it normally takes 18 months from the purchase of property, build out and construction. He stated some retailers open in the fall for the Christmas spending. He stated the business dictates what time frame the business would open.

Alderman Slinker made motion and seconded by Alderman Lewis to adjourn the meeting.

Members of the Commission,

My name is Robert Wolverton and I am applying on behalf of R. Anthony Property Holdings, LLC for annexation to the City of Ashland and rezoning of 15 acres m/I on E. Hayes Road. The request will come before you at the September 14, 2021 meeting. The following are some of the relevant details regarding this property:

Zoning Request – We are requesting General Commercial zoning for the following reasons:

- 1) This zoning supports our intended use.
- 2) This zoning is consistent with the Ashland Comprehensive Plan.
- 3) This zoning is consistent with the adjoining property to the east.

Intended Use — Our intended use is to build a campus for an organization called St. Raymond's Society (<u>www.srshelp.org</u>). SRS is a not-for-profit entity currently headquartered in Jefferson City, MO and has the following mission statement:

"St. Raymond's Society exists to serve pregnant women and new mothers in need. We provide coaching and resources to assist families in becoming self-sufficient."

Phase I of the campus would consist of two residential buildings. Each building would house two apartments for a total of four apartments. Each apartment would have four suites for the mothers and the children. This would give a total of sixteen mothers plus their children living there in Phase I. In addition, there would be a child care area intended for the use of the SRS

people – not a public, for-profit daycare. There will be a chapel only for the use of the SRS people. There would be a multi-purpose building with offices, classrooms, storage, a dining room, and a commercial kitchen to be used for teaching the mothers how to be self-sufficient.

All of the structures would be used only for the SRS clientele and staff.

Positive Features of the Property – The property is currently heavily wooded. SRS would clear only what is needed to build their buildings, parking lots, storm water facilities, and any other improvements required by the City of Ashland. This property is located on E. Hayes Road, which is a dead-end street. The leaders of SRS are very protective of the mothers and their children. A property with privacy on a dead-end road gives a higher level of control over the campus and the security of the mothers and staff. The property is located between Columbia and Jefferson City, which is the target area for SRS.

Property Impact – This project will be very low impact. Phase I of the project will use only 3-4 acres of the property. Phase II (two more residential buildings housing another sixteen mothers plus children) will be able to be built in the same area as Phase I and would not impact any more property.

Impact on Surrounding Neighbors — The impact on surrounding neighbors will be minimal. SRS will have its own on-site security and their objective is to have a campus that is quiet, private, secluded, and safe. Ironically, most people who build home on acreage lots also seek a place that is quiet, private, secluded, and safe. There will be a period where road improvements and the initial construction will be disruptive. But once that is done, SRS will be very compatible with surrounding residential properties. We estimate that E. Hayes Road, after improvements, can easily handle the 100 cars per day +/- that we believe SRS will create. Note: 100 cars per day is a rough estimate and is not based on any traffic study or any other formal study. We have met with the neighbors and have shared all of this information with the neighbors. One of the neighbors, Ed Musterman, is copied on this correspondence and has the ability to share this with the other neighbors. They have voiced opposition and we believe most of their opposition is fairly or unfairly aimed toward Lakeside Ashland. There are a few neighbors who sill resist any kind of development in this area and subscribe to the "Not In My Back Yard" philosophy.

Property Challenges – This property has the same challenges as any other newly developing area. Road improvements, utility improvements, and storm water improvements will be necessary to adequately serve the area. This property is located very close to Lakeside Ashland and will be making all of these improvements as directed by the City of Ashland Public Works Department. We are aware of the concerns regarding emergency access, noise, and other issues. Again, all of these are normal and a newly developing area.

Attached for your review is a map of the property as well as a rough site-plan for SRS. Please note, there will be many adjustments to the site plan as we move further into the process and this is not intended to portray a finished product.





AN ORDINANCE EXTENDING THE CORPORATE LIMITS OF THE CITY OF ASHLAND, MISSOURI BY ANNEXING UNINCORPORATED AREA; DIRECTING THE CITY CLERK TO GIVE NOTICE OF THE ANNEXATION

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE BOARD OF ALDERMEN OF THE CITY OF ASHLAND, MISSOURI, AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. The Board of Aldermen hereby finds that a verified petition was filed with the City on August 06, 2021 requesting annexation of land that is contiguous and compact to the existing corporate limits of the City and that is described in Section 4 of this Ordinance. This petition was signed by the owners of the fee interest of record in the land proposed to be annexed. A public hearing was held concerning this matter on September, 07 2021. Notice of this hearing was published more than fourteen days prior to the hearing in a newspaper of general circulation qualified to publish legal matters. At the public hearing all interested persons, corporations and political subdivisions were permitted to present evidence regarding the proposed annexation.

Section 2. The Board of Aldermen determines that the annexation is reasonable and necessary to the proper development of the City and that the City has the ability to furnish normal municipal services to the area to be annexed within a reasonable time.

Section 3. The Board of Aldermen determines that no written objection to the proposed annexation has been filed within fourteen days after the public hearing.

Section 4. The Board of Aldermen hereby extends the city limits by annexing the land described as 15.15 acre tract located off of E. Log Providence Road on E. Hayes Road. The tract of land in the Northwest Quarter of Section 27, Township 47 North, Range 12 West, Boone County records being shown and described as by the Survey recorded October 10, 2017 as instrument No. 2017020867 in Book 4813, Page 183, Records of Boone County, Missouri-Parcel Number 21-800-27-00-002.00. Appendix "A" of Chapter 1 of the City Code is hereby amended to include the land described above.

Section 5. The City Clerk is hereby authorized and directed to cause three certified copies of this ordinance to be filed with the Clerk of Boone County, Missouri and three certified copies with the Assessor of Boone County, Missouri. The City Clerk is further authorized and directed to forward to the Missouri Department of Revenue, by registered or certified mail, a certified copy of this ordinance and a map of the City clearly showing the area annexed into the City.

Section 6. The property described in Exhibit "A" is located in Ward One.

Section 7. This ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after its passage and approval.

Re: Civil Plan Review Fee

EXECUTIVE SUMMARY:

Proposed language changes to Chapter 9 & 10 of City Code to allow for the City of Ashland to charge civil plan review fees performed by City staff

DISCUSSION:

With the recent hire of a part time civil engineer the City of Ashland will perform civil plan reviews in house. The current Code allows for a 3rd party engineering firm to review civil plans on behalf of the City for code compliance. The ordinance change will keep that provision but also allow us to charge a fee when City staff performs the plan review. I wanted to keep the provision of having a 3rd party do the review based on work load, complexity of the project and staff levels. The fee will be a straight hourly rate of \$80.00/hr. The average rate of 3rd party review firm's is approximately \$140.00/hr. Having a review rate of \$80.00/hr will be beneficial to submitting applicants while still maintaining a good cost recovery for the Community Development. The hours will be billed at the end of the project the same as we currently do with a 3rd party review firm.

FISCAL IMPACT:

Short Term Impact: Varies depending on work load.

Long Term Impact: Varies depending on work load.

SUGGESTED BOARD ACTION:

Staff recommends approval of this Ordinance change.

AN ORDINANCE TO AMEND CHAPTER 10, PLANNING, ZONING, SUBDIVISIONS, BUILDING OF THE CITY OF ASHLAND CODE

AN ORDINANCE TO AMEND CHAPTER 9, PLANNING AND ZONING OF THE CITY OF ASHLAND CODE, SECTION 9.106. REVIEW PLANS AND DOCUMENTS SUBMISSION, REVIEW REQUIRED

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE BOARD OF ALDERMEN OF THE CITY OF ASHLAND, MISSOURI, AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. Chapter 9, Planning and Zoning of the City of Ashland, Missouri.

9.106. Site Plan Submission, Review Required

- 9.106. Review Plans and Documents Submission, Review Required Any property owner who proposes to develop land within any district, shall submit a set of Review Plans and Documents to the City. Such Review Plans and Documents shall be required when land in district R-1 is subdivided for single family residences but not when an individual lot in District R-1 is developed for a single family residence. Review Plans and Documents shall include the following elements:
- A. Meet the standards of the City of Ashland's long range plan.
- B. Comply with all applicable local, state and federal ordinances, rules, statutes, laws, regulations and requirements.
- C. North arrow and scale. All site plans are to be drawn to a standard engineer's scale. All items shown on the review plan, including, but not limited to, street, driveways, and buildings shall be drawn to scale. The actual scale used will depend on the development and shall be subject to approval of the City Engineer. All sites submitted for review shall be surveyed by a Missouri licensed land surveyor.
- D. Topography and Contours. Existing topography with contours at 5-foot intervals, and delineating any land areas within the 100-year floodplain. Finished grades or contours for entire site (5 or 1-foot contour intervals may be required depending on the site).
- E. Proposed location of buildings and other structures, parking areas, drives, walks, screening, drainage patterns, public streets and any existing easements. Location, width and limits of all existing and proposed sidewalks. Location, size and radii of all existing and proposed median breaks, turning lanes, streets, roadways and parking lots.
- F. All adjacent public street right-of-way, existing and proposed, with centerline location. All adjacent public street and private drive locations, widths, curb cuts and radii (existing and proposed).
- G. Location of all required building and parking setbacks.
- H. Location, dimensions, number of stories and area in square feet of proposed buildings.
- I. Area of land on review plan in square feet or acres.
- J. Limits, location, size and material to be used in all proposed retaining walls.
- K. Location, height, candle power and type of outside lighting fixtures for buildings and parking lots. Illumination Plan overlaid on review plan.
- L. Location, size, type of material and message of all proposed monument or detached signs.

- M. Storm water collection, detention, and erosion control plans and calculations.
- N. Analysis of the capacity of the existing sanitary sewer receiving system.
- O. Building elevations: Elevations of all sides of proposed buildings, including notation indicating building material to be used on exteriors and roofs. Location, size and materials to be used in all screening of rooftop mechanical equipment. P. Traffic Impact Analysis (TIA). A TIA may be required by the City Administrator whose decision is appealable to the Planning and Zoning Commission whose decision is appealable to the Board of Aldermen. In addition, the Planning and Zoning Commission and Board of Aldermen on their own motion may require a TIA. Elements which will be considered in the termination of requiring a TIA, include, but are not limited to:
- 1. Areas of existing high traffic congestion.

2. Proposed development of a size, i.e., building square footage, number of employees, that a significant increase in area traffic is expected.

The Review Plans and Documents shall be submitted to the City Clerk at least thirty (30) days before the Planning and Zoning Commission meeting at which it will be considered for approval. The City Clerk shall forward the review plans and documents to appropriate city staff and/or consultants who shall review and make a recommendation to the Planning and Zoning Commission for approval or disapproval of the review plan and documents based on whether the plans and documents meet the requirements of this section. The Planning and Zoning Commission shall approve, approve conditionally or disapprove the review plan and documents. If the Commission disapproves the review plans and documents, it shall provide written reasons for disapproval. Review plans and documents disapproval decisions made by the Planning and Zoning Commission may be appealed by the Board of Adjustment as outlined in 10.160.(amended 4-17-2018, Ordinance No. 1177)

EXECUTIVE SUMMARY:

Authorization is needed to award the Billy Joe Sapp Dr Stormwater Materials Bid to the appropriate vendor(s) and provide them with a Notice to Proceed.

DISCUSSION:

Ashland Public Works (APW) staff recently sent out a bid invitation to multiple vendors for various stormwater materials that will be needed for the Billy Joe Sapp Dr Stormwater Improvement Project.

Vendor	Material	Total
Precision Precast	Inlet & Junction Boxes	\$10,987.74
Champion Precast Inc.	Inlet & Junction Boxes	\$12,402.00
Water and Sewer Supply Inc.	HDPE Pipe	\$16,012.50
Core & Main	HDPE Pipe	\$17,017.50

This RFQ required that these materials would be delivered by 10/27/2021. Ashland Public Works staff will complete the work on this project, with an anticipated start date some time in November 2021 (weather permitting).

FISCAL IMPACT:

Precision Precast's bid of \$10,987.74 for the inlet/junction boxes, along with Water and Sewer Supply Inc.'s bid of \$16,012.50 for the HDPE pipe are the low bids for their portions of the required materials.

The total for both bids is \$27,000.24. This is significantly less than the \$50,000 that was budgeted for these materials, as the materials market has been rather volatile this year.

These bids are competitive with the other received bids and came in lower than was budgeted for this project. Precision Precast and Water and Sewer Supply Inc. are both reputable vendors who have a long history of satisfactory business with the City of Ashland.

SUGGESTED BOARD ACTION:

If the Board of Alderpersons agrees with the staff recommendation, the Mayor should be allowed to enter into contract with Precision Precast and Water and Sewer Supply Inc., and authorize staff to issue a Notice to Proceed.
